Hagan and Dodge Power Brokers Funny Car Charge from No. 1 Qualifier at NHRA Arizona Nationals to Tony Stewart Racing's First Final Round Appearance

- Matt Hagan powered his Tony Stewart Racing (TSR) Dodge Charger SRT Hellcat Funny Car from the No. 1
  qualifier position to the fledgling team's first final round appearance at 37th annual National Hot Rod
  Association (NHRA) Arizona Nationals
- No. 5 seed Cruz Pedregon drove his Snap-On Tool Dodge Charger SRT Hellcat Funny Car to a quarterfinal appearance at Wild Horse Pass Motorsports Park near Phoenix
- Leah Pruett qualified her Dodge//SRT Top Fuel dragster ninth on the eliminations ladder and made her quickest pass of the weekend in the first round of eliminations
- Pruett and her Dodge Power Brokers dragster seeded No. 6 for the NHRA Top Fuel All-Star Callout specialty race set to take place at the upcoming NHRA Gatornationals March 10-13

February 27, 2022, Chandler, Arizona - It was a weekend of firsts for the newly formed Tony Stewart Racing (TSR) as Matt Hagan muscled his Dodge Power Brokers Charger SRT Hellcat Funny Car from the No. 1 qualifier position to a final round appearance at the 37th annual National Hot Rod Association (NHRA) Arizona Nationals at Wild Horse Pass Motorsports Park.

A three-time winner at the Phoenix event, Hagan and his Dodge Charger SRT Hellcat rocketed to the top of the timing sheets with the final qualifying pass, a 3.823-second effort at 333.41 mph to reset the category's previous track record of 3.826 seconds and post the quickest Funny Car pass in more than four years, earning the team's first No. 1 qualifier position and the 44th of his career.

From the top rung of the eliminations ladder, Hagan launched into Sunday with quick starts and consistent 3.850, 3.864 and 3.875-second runs to claim round wins over Terry Haddock, Alexis DeJoria and Tim Wilkerson and take TSR to its first NHRA final round appearance.

In a rematch of last weekend's Winternationals semifinal, Hagan matched up with No. 2 qualifier Robert Hight to battle for the Wally trophy. Hagan was quicker on the tree to give the Dodge Power Brokers Charger SRT Hellcat the early lead when at the 600ft mark a dropped cylinder moved them out of the groove to give the team its first runner-up finish after just two national events.

Fellow Dodge Charger SRT Hellcat driver Cruz Pedregon staged his Snap-on Tools Funny Car for eliminations from the No. 5 spot on the ladder for his 625th national event appearance to put him third on the all-time list. After reaching a milestone 600 round wins last weekend at the Winternationals with his semi final appearance, Pedregon added another by turning on the winlights in the opening round against Jeff Diehl. In his quarterfinal match-up with Tim Wilkerson, the Cruz Pedregon Racing machine took the early lead but lost a good battle to the finish line.

In Top Fuel action, TSR pilot Leah Pruett, a two-time winner at Phoenix, kicked off the weekend by powering her Dodge//SRT dragster (sporting the Sparkling Ice +Caffeine livery) to a strong first qualifying run to put her third on the timesheets with a 3.703 second pass at 328.22 mph. Unable to improve on that first pass, the time put her ninth on the eliminations ladder and set up a first round matchup against No. 8 seed Josh Hart.

The opening round battle saw Pruett take her 11-thousand horsepower HEMI-powered dragster for a 3.699-second pass, her quickest run of the weekend, against her opponent's 3.705-second slower lap which unfortunately combined with his quicker start, helped him score a holeshot win.

While disappointed with her performance in the first two national events of the season, Pruett is focused on the positive progression her new team is making and looking forward to the upcoming NHRA Gatornationals where her Dodge Power Brokers dragster will also be among the eight competitors battling in the NHRA Top Fuel All-Star Callout.

The field for the specialty race is set based on a combination of the 2021 season-end points and qualifying points from the first two events of 2022, with reigning Top Fuel world champion Steve Torrence already set as the top seed. The No. 1 seed will "call out" his first choice of opponent on Friday at the Gainesville, Florida, national event with the next pick going to the No. 2 seed and down the line. Pruett is seeded sixth for the first of three rounds set to take place during Saturday qualifying at the Gatornationals set to take place March 10-13.

### Leah Pruett, Dodge Power Brokers Top Fuel Dragster

(No. 9 Qualifier - 3.703 seconds at 328.22 mph)

Round 1: (0.127-second reaction time, 3.699 seconds at 330.07 mph) loss to No. 8 Josh Hart (0.093/3.705/332.10)

"We had a real good draw for the first round against Josh Hart. There is no good way to lose, but as a driver, the worst possible way to lose is on a hole shot, and that's what we had here. For me, two weekends in a row, I have mini two-stepped it, so we have a sequence of negative events that are happening for me on my side of the office. The impressive part is that this team has been able to provide us with a car that is consistent, healthy and running 3.60s. I'm most impressed with the crew members having my back, knowing that we are going to work as a team to correct what I've got going on up there. Personally, I'm in such a different head space and enjoying it. I think I'm wanting it more than I ever have. We've all put so much effort into making this operation happen and I just want to go out there and kill it. As a result I'm just a little early (two stepping it), which results in being too late on the tree.

"I'm now looking forward to the Pep Boys NHRA Top Fuel All-Star Call out (at Gainesville) and really do not give one tiny atom of an iota of whoever calls me out or if I get to call somebody out. I'm focused on going out on qualifying and getting to race somebody and fixing my problems. That's what's exciting to me. I'm focusing on getting my game. You probably won't hear from me for the next two weeks as I focus on getting ready for the Gatornationals, work on a couple of different items to get back into a performance advantage in the cockpit."

"What a wonderful weekend here in Arizona. It's just special here. I would have loved to have gotten the first win here for TSR with Tony (Stewart) and Leah (Pruett) and with everybody from our Radford (Racing) family here that shows us lots of love and support. What I am most proud of this weekend is my guys. They made quick turnarounds, nothing was falling off the race car, they're gelling really well and things are starting to flow. That's huge to me as that builds competence. I know (Crew Chief) Dickie Venables is capable of. I know we're going to win a lot of races and get a lot of trophies and the big picture on our mind is that championship.

"There is still a learning curve, but one thing about Dickie, he learns fast and he's very methodical about what we do. I feel good with our lights and the way the Dodge Charger SRT Hellcat is running and driving. I know Robert Hight has pulled off two wins now, but it's just a matter of time before we start pulling in wins for TSR over here. They give us all the parts and pieces that we need. This Dodge Power Brokers Hellcat has been running strong, we sat on the pole and we're just piecing it together little-by-little. Really proud of everybody in this organization.

"We put a hole out on the run (dropped a cylinder) trying to run really hard. We wanted to get back to that record run again and put everything back up the same way, but when you do that, you put a lot of fuel and volume in there and sometimes it's just too much. It just didn't go our way this weekend but we've got Gainesville coming up and I'm

excited about that. I haven't yet won the Gatornationals so I think that's one I need to put down in my record book."

"Overall it was a great weekend for the Snap-on Tools Dodge Hellcat. We qualified in the Top 5 and made it to the quarterfinals. We had a close loss to Wilkerson 3.85 to a 3.90. We were in the race till the end, overall great effort by the Snap-on team. I'm proud of my guys, and we'll keep chipping away at it. The team will travel back to Indy and prepare the new chassis for our upcoming eastern debut at the Gatornationals in Gainesville."
